## What to wear and what NOT to wear

## **Shoes**

Plain black shoes – they must have a back but the heel can be any height. Small embellishments are allowed. The entire shoe should be black

#### **ALLOWED**









### **NOT ALLOWED**

No large gold or silver buckles or chains. No open-toed or backless shoes. No boots. No white trim











## Suit, trousers, skirt

The suit, trousers or skirt can be black, dark navy (almost black) or very dark charcoal grey. The skirt can be any length, but must be worn with black opaque tights

#### **ALLOWED**









#### **NOT ALLOWED**

Light grey, pin stripes, polka dots, other decorations or colours are not allowed









## **Shirt**

The shirt should be plain white, with a collar and white buttons

### <u>ALLOWED</u>





### **NOT ALLOWED**

No beige or off-white shirts, no buttons of a different colour. The shirt must have a collar









# <u>Tie</u>

The tie can be a white or black bow tie, a black tie or a ribbon

### <u>ALLOWED</u>











### **NOT ALLOWED**

No bow ties of any other colour or with a pattern





## Tights and socks

If wearing a skirt, you must wear black tights of 40 denier or higher. The whole leg must be covered. If wearing trousers, black socks are to be worn

#### <u>ALLOWED</u>



#### **NOT ALLOWED**

No white, patterned or colourful socks. No bare legs or ankles





Please note: If you wear a headdress/scarf for religious reasons, a black scarf should be worn.
